A phone call came into dispatch a request for an officer to put down a dog that had a tumor and the owner felt wasn't savable. Our on site volunteer Lisa, said we will take her and have her humanely euthanized. In route to

making this happen our other on-site volunteer Pam thought she should be evaluated first. We Care Animal hospital in Clintonville discovered she had a mammary gland tumor. Her bloodwork showed she also had Lyme. Both problems could be corrected - one with surgery and the other with a mere 30-day regimen of antibiotics. She is currently in a foster home waiting for her surgery and is doing

remarkably well. This surgery is most often needed for female dogs that have not been spayed. One of our missions is to help spay and neuter as many as we are able. Candy is just one example. Your donations and love will add years to this little dog's life. ~ Lisa and Pam

Another Successful Clinic On May 7th we held another full scale dog clinic - the first clinic including spaying and neutering since the virus. It was held at the transit building in Keshena. We treated 171 dogs. 31 dogs were neutered, 20 dogs spayed, 145 received DHLL vaccines, 124 were blood tested for heartworm and the tick diseases and 115 received the rabies vaccine. Of the dogs tested, 58 dogs tested positive for lyme (46.8 %), 9 tested positive for anaplasmosis (7.2 %), 2 tested positive for erlichia, (1.6 %) and 6 tested positive for heartworm (4.8%). At one point when we first started our clinics 57% of the dogs tested positive for lyme and 35% tested positive for heartworm. We are so blessed to have the veterinarians and vet-tecs that are so loyal and come from such distances for our clinics. One volunteer of special note is Val Adams and her crew. Val drew blood from all 124 dogs. This remarkable group drove over 200 miles. More news about our clinics coming soon.

We are so grateful for your donations which give most of these stories a happy ending. We continue projects that are in addition to the clinics: fielding the many phone calls for medical assistance and questions, caring for and transporting dozens of animals all over northeastern Wisconsin to their new homes, and picking up and delivering dog and cat food.
